



Journey Through UNITI

Cat started with UNITI in 2020 as a Summer Student at UNITI's Acquired Brain Injury Services (ABIS). Working four days a week at ABIS, Cat supported day-to-day activities. Once a week, Cat was at UNITI's South Campus location, where they worked on a video project with UNITI partner, the Self-Advocates of Semiahmoo. Working out of different locations, Cat was able to be involved in many areas at UNITI.

Returning in 2021, Cat worked as a Summer Student for The Semiahmoo Foundation following their connection with the video project completed in 2020. Here, Cat planned a UNITI Fashion Show, UNITI's Annual Picnic that was held virtually, supported the Community Development Committee, and organized and hosted UNITI's first 'Pride Panel', as well as supported The Semiahmoo Foundation with some grant projects.

Projects and grants are a major factor in UNITI's ability to provide quality services for people we support, families and the greater community. These projects help enhance UNITI services and through them, UNITI has developed impactful and everlasting partners.

UNITI's Recreation and Leisure (R&L) Services continue to host some of the **most-liked classes** within the organization.

These services offers a wide range of recreational **programs** adapted to the unique needs and abilities of people. With the funding from the Province of BC through a Gaming Grant, UNITI's R&L services have been able to offer a variety of services all week, including Friday Flix, social night, fitness & sports classes and much more!

R&L services are funded through grants, donations, endowment funds, and affordable user fees.

UNITI's R&L philosophy is that we strive to provide a **safe and fun environment** that enables people to access the community, express themselves creatively, learn new and exciting things, all while having fun!



MUSIC HEALS

The funds provided by Music Heals goes toward the operations of music therapy classes. There are **hundreds of people** that benefit from these classes, they remain the most popular classes offered.

UNITI has daily music classes presented virtually, open to anyone using UNITI services. With the transition back to inperson programs, these classes have been a great way to bridge those who are staying home and those who are attending programs in person - bringing everyone together. During the pandemic, these classes were essential for maintaining valuable connections for the people using UNITI services.

Recently, UNITI's Musical
Theatre program resumed to an
in-person format (which has
been a well-loved and popular
program for many years). With
this funding, in the coming
months, UNITI will begin to host
more in-person options for our
Community Inclusion Services.

UNITI partner **The Semiahmoo Foundation** donated over **\$153,000** in the last year to UNITI services in addition to donations and funding.

Canada



This program is funded by the Government of Canada and the Province of British Columbia.

The IMPACT project was developed in 2019 in response to the low labour market participation of individuals with disabilities in BC. The IMPACT project was initiated in 2020 by eight member organizations of the BC Employment Network. The project involves three cohorts of youth over three years and UBC is the research arm in this project

The goal of the IMPACT Youth Employment Research Project is to support transitioning youth with disabilities in a structured research and innovative pilot project. The project will **improve employment related planning and supports**.

Outcomes reveal an increase in overall paid and unpaid work experience through the youth's engagement with IMPACT. This project is entering its third year and is looking forward to creating a more accessible labour market.



vancouver foundation

Since our inception in 1958, UNITI has supported people who have developmental disabilities to be **fully included and valued** in their communities.

UNITI has found that youth (ages 13 18) who have developmental disabilities are not included or connected with their communities in the same manner that youth who do not have disabilities. This is a pressing issue that UNITI is committed to working on and finding out how it can create change so that youth with disabilities are better included.

Through the 'Develop Grant' funding stream from the Vancouver Foundation, UNITI was able to conduct a study reaching hundreds of people to get feedback on how to better include youth with disabilities. With this information, UNITI aims to facilitate better adapted and integrated youth programs.











HOW UNITI IS GETTING BETTER

What is PQI?

Performance and Quality Improvement (PQI) is a part of being an accredited organization through the Council on Accreditation (COA). It is a process used by UNITI to ensure we have **high quality services and well performing systems**. This is an ongoing process as quality improvement is continuous.

PQI supports UNITI to **achieve its mission** by establishing specific, measurable and time-limited outcomes related to our mission and regular consultations with our stakeholders about the impact of those outcomes. Using a balance of qualitative and quantitative data collection from our stakeholders, PQI supports UNITI to understand what that data means, identify where changes are needed and most importantly, celebrate our achievements.

What Have We Done?

While much has happened within UNITI we are focusing on three areas:
1) Short-Term Planning, 2) Redesign of Annual Surveys, and 3) Internal Training Opportunities.

Short-Term Planning

UNITI has implemented a new short-term planning tool, the Logic Models, for all programs and services. These Logic Models are used to ensure our services have the impact they were designed for. The benefits will also include a more transparent and accessible view of how things are going.

Annual Survey

UNITI's annual survey was redesigned to be more accessible and better aligned with UNITI's mission. Responses are now easier analyzed and combined with other data UNITI collects regarding the impact. This work could not be done without people we support through the Ends Review Committee and the Self Advocates of Semiahmoo.

Training

UNITI has prioritized and is providing further resources, information, education, and training in the areas of race, culture, gender and sexuality. The purpose of this is to increase awareness, develop healthy relationships and ensure staff are equip with resources and tools to better support people who use our services.



AFFORDABLE & INCLUSIVE HOUSING

UNITI's housing model was selected as one of the top three Canadian models of inclusive housing by Inclusion Canada.



PEHS exists to ensure there is housing built that fits the needs of the community and is affordable and inclusive. UNITI partner PEHS has been an important part of the community for over 40 years. Over the last year, UNITI's housing has received astounding support from all over the province and UNITI continues to advocate for the desperate need for this type of housing.

As a significant land owner in Surrey, UNITI is in a position of strength to provide housing for the community. UNITI is looking forward to being able to provide more homes for people in the community who need a place to call home. 
LOOKING IN: Hearing from Logan & Tegan

What are the Ends?

The Ends are what UNITI strives to achieve. They are created through comprehensive consultations with our community. The Ends consultations are one way that UNITI holds itself accountable. UNITI celebrates what we are successfully achieving and strive to do better in areas where we fall short.

The Ends Consultation Committee and UNITI staff had conversations with **71** people to ask, listen and learn.

What are the Ends Consultations?

Every year, UNITI holds a consultation led by people with disabilities to check in to see how people are doing. This is to support people in living good lives of their choosing. By hosting these consultations, UNITI is able to see what is going well, where we can improve and receive recommendations from self-advocates.

This year, the 2021-2022 consultations were about:
